Feeding Directions:

High energy 16% Range Cube is an all natural corn based cube with a Total Digestible Nutrient (TDN) of 70 and a maximum of 10% fiber. TDN is a measurement of energy with a number above 65 providing very high levels of energy to your cattle during winter feeding times. Energy is the most limiting nutrient needed by the cow to produce milk, grow, and to develop a fetus. Energy is also needed to maintain proper body condition on your cattle. If a cow loses body condition, she may not have a normal estrus cycle. This cost you money by increasing calving intervals with these cows. By supplying adequate energy to your cattle, the producer will lower their number of repeat breeders, thereby, lowering his calving interval and increasing profits. This cube, when fed at 3 pounds per head per day, with average quality forage, will also supply the recommended levels of protein required by the brood cow. This cube will provide supplemental minerals and vitamins, but a free choice mineral is still recommended for optimum levels of mineral intake. This cube is conveniently designed to be fed directly on the ground. This cube is very hard and will not break apart in normal feeding situations. Feed the cube at a rate of 3 to 5 pounds per head per day depending on the type forage available, stage of production, body condition and environmental conditions. This is nutritionally the very best cube that we can offer to our producers. This cube can be fed at a lower rate costing you less money per head per day to supplement your herd.

Important Management Practices:

Provide a source of fresh clean water and free choice mineral at all times. Forage should be provided at all times. When making any change in an animal's diet, plan a 7 to 10 day transition period. Feeders should protect feed from becoming wet and moldy. Poorly managed feeding programs can increase the possibility of feeding disorders.
